Second Wounaan CBC in the Darien was very successful. Through a United Nations Small Grant, the communities of Rio Hondo and Rio Platanares were able to participate with their 10 birders who are studying bird identification. They came 6hours by boat from the ocean up the river Lara to participate in one day of pre-CBC training, the count and the compilation. The Puerto Lara birding groups-Oropendolas Negras and Tangaras Azules participated in the pre-CBC activities, the count and the compilation.

There were 5 routes. We were lucky to have a boat route, the sendero route, and two other road and field routes. At the end of the day, 18 of us gathered to visit all 9 homes of the Tangaras Azules. Each woman would describe the birds and nests they have and had around their homes. It was wonderful to see each of them be the center of their "bird world".

The Second count had 14 first time birds for this CBC. 30+ birds had higher counts than the previous year and best of all one brand new bird for the Puerto Lara area.
